Good Spoonplugging

What are the two variables in fishing that make it either good or bad?

Weather and water conditions. What determines if the fishing is good or bad when talking about the weather and water conditions? Stability is the key word for both conditions. We must view both when considering how the fishing will be when it is time to go fishing. We all know that a cold front is what we look at as far as the weather. A cold front is where two air masses meet and cause a disturbance and this is what gives us our weather. We look at this condition more as a light condition.

Pre- frontal conditions may offer several days if we are lucky with a building of temperature and cloud cover. We look at this as being stable. The more days between the fronts, the better the fish move. Some fronts are very severe. The severe ones occur because there is more of a difference in temperatures at the point where the two fronts meet. At times, there could be fronts that are so mild, that it may be hardly noticed. But if you pay attention to the light condition, you will see that a front did occur. If a front occurs and the cloud cover stays around for a day or two, you could still have some good movements occur.

But when you wake up on a post frontal condition and see a bright clear sky, you had better plan on putting in a long hard day if you want to catch a fish.

Sometimes we get into where we have a changing weather and water condition. We might be fishing a river or a reservoir where they can control the water levels. We might wake up with a cold front with bright clear skies and see that they have lowered the water levels by three or four feet. We now have double trouble. We could look at the fall turn over as a changing water condition. Actually, we are into a changing water condition as I am writing this article. We have lost our high temperatures gradually and the night time temperatures have already caused the algae blooms to go away. You can notice that on most of the lakes, the water is much clearer than it was a couple of weeks ago. So a change is already starting and will continue until the water temps become around 45 degrees. So we must consider the color of the water as a variable and can expect fish movements to not be as good as they were just a couple of weeks ago. It is just an observation but one that must be noticed by you as a fisherman and understood. This last front was the major change that will end the summer period and start the fall turnover. We want to look at both weather and water in terms of stability and that will tell the story. When one or both are stable, look for good fishing. When one or both are changing or unstable, then fishing will be more difficult. This is a guideline that Mr. Perry found that worked for him and he passed it on to us. Thank god that he did.
