The following is a passage from Buck Perry's home study course: Presentation of Lures.

"Today you and I have a lot of "aids" to help us in "fishing." In our study we have discussed the more important ones, but in the final analysis (with all these aids), it comes down to the presentation of lures, as to whether we put the fish on the stringer.

It has been pointed out; in order to have fishing success you and I must do our fishing at the right place, at the right time, and in the right manner. This means exactly what it says - FISHING, and this means PRESENTATION of LURES. We could have all the aids, and all the knowledge, but if we fail on the Presentation of Lures, these things aren't worth very much. BUT, if we didn't have the knowledge or the proper aids, we couldn't do a very good job of Presentation of Lures.

Fishing can be bad and usually is, and if you and I do not exercise discipline in our presentation, we are not likely to succeed very often. We must fish in the right **manner** as to be at the right place at the right time as **fast** as possible, and as often as possible. This means we must go about our fishing in a orderly and precise manner - not haphazardly."
